

History Trip

Our Year 7 historians enjoyed a fantastic day in Canterbury on the 14th of November, visiting both Canterbury Cathedral and the Roman Museum. The trip brilliantly their current supported inquiry into "How far did the Romans change Britain?" and helped students deepen their understanding conceptual innovation, change, and perspective by seeing history in context.

At the Roman Museum, students took part in an engaging workshop led by the museum's curators. They had the opportunity to handle artefacts, explore authentic examples of Roman technology, and consider how these innovations shaped daily life in Britain. They demonstrated strong ATL communication and thinking skills, asking thoughtful, high-quality questions that impressed everyone involved.



The visit to Canterbury Cathedral offered powerful contrast. enabling students make to meaningful interdisciplinary connections and understand how Britain continued to develop long after the Roman period. This supported their exploration of the wider global context of orientation in space and time, helping them see how societies evolve across centuries.



It was an inspiring day that deepened understanding of our MYP history units, and sparked genuine curiosity about Britain's past.
